TEMPLE BOARD NEWS

Annual stockholders meeting of the Lyndhurst Masonic Temple Company was held on January 14, 2008. Since most of you never see the annual president's report, I am reprinting a copy below.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT – JANUARY 14, 2008

The Lyndhurst Temple Company finished 2007 with a budget surplus of approximately \$9,000. This was the result of significant reductions in custodial salaries, equipment repairs, delayed utility bills and 2006 rent payments received in 2007. Outside of equipment repairs, that we cannot control, the increase in income and the decrease in custodial salaries should not occur in 2008. The surplus has been carried over into the 2008 budget. Next year is budgeted with a deficit of approximately \$3,000 including the rollover and with no increase in rents. The temple is still operating within its income and has not had to subsidize its operation from assets. The 2008 budget will be presented at the Board meeting following this meeting.

Several building improvements were completed in 2007.

- *A work party was held in August with the following items accomplished:
 - Reversed locks on bathroom stall for easier handicapped access.
 - Replaced missing and damaged floor tiles.
 - Installed signs for two additional handicapped parking spaces.
 - Cleaned lodge room and polished woodwork.
 - Varnished windowsills in the lobby.
- *Cleaned rug in Lodge room.
- *Installed locks on Friendship room cabinets and distributed keys.
- *Forest City Lodge, Windermere OES and the Brown Baggers participated in the Lyndhurst Home Days parade.
- *The major bodies and one appendant body of the Temple got together to sponsor the first all Temple Holidays party for the children.

As you can see we are projecting a \$3000 deficit for 2008. The single largest controllable expense is the electric bill. Last year it amounted to about 20% of the budget. Please turn off all lights when not needed and make sure that all the lights are off before leaving the Temple. There have been several instances of lights being left on after functions.

It was recently discovered that the two wheelchairs the Temple owned couldn't be located. If anyone knows their whereabouts please notify the Temple board. **If anyone has an unused wheelchair that they could donate to the Temple it would be greatly appreciated.**

The temple board will be sponsoring an "All Temple Spaghetti Dinner" on April 13th from 5:00pm to 7:00pm. Adults \$6.00 and children 5 and under free.
